According to the World Bank, approximately 8.5% of the world's population around 700 million people were living in extreme poverty as of 2022, surviving on less than \$2.15 per day. Although this represents a decline compared to previous years, the pace of poverty reduction has slowed due to economic disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, geopolitical tensions, and rising inflation. These challenges have highlighted the importance of efficient public spending and well-targeted social support mechanisms.

Uzbekistan has made significant progress in reducing poverty and strengthening its social protection system in recent years. Official statistics indicate that the national poverty rate decreased from around 11% in 2023 to approximately 8.9% in 2024. This improvement reflects the government's active efforts to expand social assistance programs, increase budget allocations for vulnerable populations, and implement targeted reforms. In particular, the introduction of unified social registries and digital platforms has improved the identification of low-income households and enhanced the transparency of benefit distribution [1].

State budget expenditures in Uzbekistan have increasingly prioritized social sectors, including education, healthcare, and social protection. In recent years, more than 50% of total public expenditures have been directed toward social spending. For instance, in 2024, a substantial portion of the state budget was allocated to social protection programs, including child benefits, pensions, and targeted financial assistance for low-income families. These measures have played a crucial role in mitigating income inequality and supporting households facing economic hardship.

Despite these positive developments, several challenges remain in ensuring the efficiency of state budget funds. One of the key issues is the accuracy of targeting mechanisms, as not all assistance reaches the most vulnerable groups. Administrative inefficiencies, limited monitoring and evaluation systems, and potential misallocation of resources can reduce the overall impact of social spending. Countries that have successfully reduced poverty levels often combine targeted cash transfers with active labor market policies, education, and healthcare investments. In this regard, Uzbekistan has been actively adopting best practices, including the use of digital tools, data-driven decision-making, and institutional reforms aimed at strengthening accountability and transparency in public finance management [3].

The use of digital platforms, unified social registries, and data analytics allows governments to better identify eligible beneficiaries, reduce duplication, and enhance transparency. At the same time, the share of social protection spending within the total state budget rose from 48% to 54%, demonstrating the government's growing commitment to social welfare policies. The number of beneficiaries also increased significantly, reaching 3.2 million people in 2024, which reflects the expansion of social assistance programs and improved access to support. 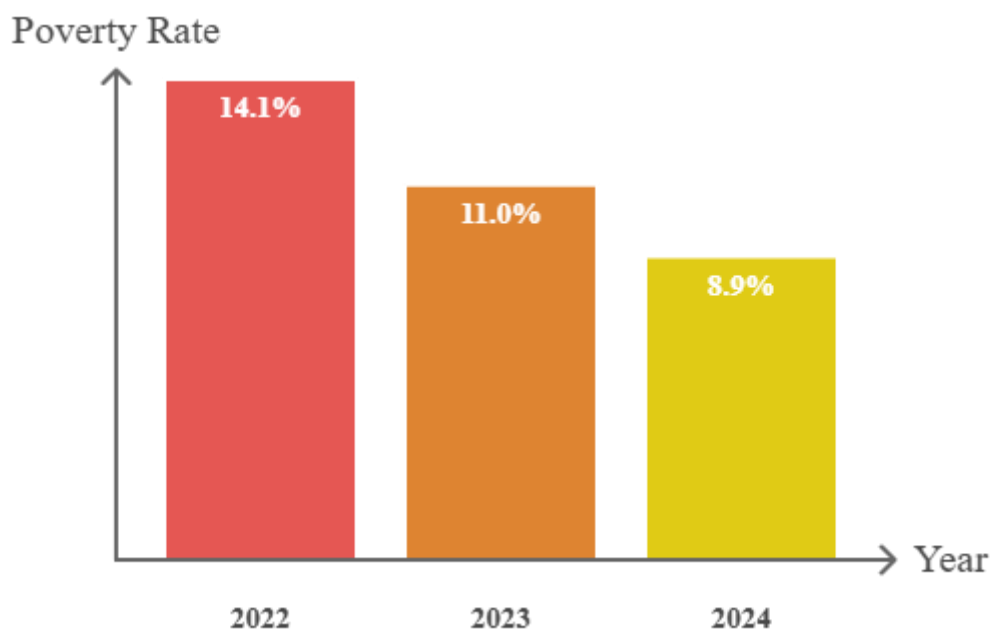


Figure 1. Poverty Rate Reduction in Uzbekistan (2022–2024) [10]
