

PROMOTION OF THE GERMAN LANGUAGE IN UZBEKISTAN

Introduction

German is one of the most widely spoken languages in the world, ranking tenth among all languages. It is also the most widely spoken and around 130 million people in the world speak German as their mother tongue.

German is primarily spoken in the European Union and is an official language in Germany, Austria, Belgium, Liechtenstein and Luxembourg. German is also an official language in Switzerland. In addition, 7.5 million people in 42 countries belong to the German-speaking minority.

The German language has its own place and prestige in Uzbekistan. Today, cooperation in the fields of culture, art, science, public education, healthcare and sports is of great importance in bilateral relations. The cooperation of the National University of Uzbekistan and Samarkand University with the universities named after Humboldt and the cities of Bamberg and Göttingen is developing effectively. About 25 thousand people of German nationality live in the Republic of Uzbekistan.

Taking into account the prestige of the German language and creating the necessary conditions for the popularization of learning foreign languages among the population and their perfect mastery, coordination of the introduction of internationally recognized programs and textbooks for teaching foreign languages at all stages of education, and modern training of teachers. Many efforts are being made to ensure the implementation of the tasks of developing teaching skills. An international scientific and practical online conference on the topic "Teaching German in the age of digital technologies" will be held in cooperation with the Agency for Popularization of Foreign Language Learning under the Cabinet of Ministers and the Goethe Institute in Uzbekistan, based on the "Doch3" program of the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD). passed. The conference discussed the most relevant and important scientific topics of modern science, new educational programs, as well as technical and scientific developments.

At the beginning of the conference, a number of works related to the field of science, teaching and development of foreign languages, in particular, the establishment of effective teaching of the German language in our country, new educational and methodological methods using innovative technologies Implementation of applications, technical possibilities, problems



related to modern methodology and current issues were discussed.

At separate meetings of the branch, a number of lectures on scientific topics were heard by experts and referees from Germany, Uzbekistan and other countries on the main areas of the conference. These directions included issues such as German language teaching programs and digital technologies in the continuing education system, general and vocational German language teaching, and the strengthening of the teacher training system in this regard. After the lectures, debates and discussions were held on these issues.

We know that there are many talented teachers who know the German language well in our country and they have achieved and are achieving many achievements. But in the following years, due to the lack of attention paid to the German language, it was not very popular among our youth. But our young people who have learned the German language have only benefited from their knowledge of this language and do not regret it at all.

Germany is an important trade and economic partner of Uzbekistan. During the years of independence, more than two hundred separate and joint enterprises were established by German entrepreneurs in our country.

German companies are actively participating in the construction industry of our country, in particular, only one enterprise "KNAUF" has established its production in many regions of our country. JV MAN Auto-Uzbekistan, an Uzbek-German joint venture operating in Samarkand, produces trucks of various models that meet global requirements.

DAAD - German Academic Exchange Service, Konrad Adenauer, Friedrich Ebert, Gerda Henkel, Alexander Humboldt, Naumann Foundation, Goethe Institute and other German organizations have been actively cooperating with the educational system of Uzbekistan. DAAD alone provides scholarships in the amount of one million euros almost every year for Uzbek students, doctoral students and scientific staff to study, engage in scientific activities, and enrich their experience in Germany.

Due to the initiative of the German-Uzbek scientific society DUWG, established under the University of Freiburg, Germany, great humanitarian and consultative support is being provided to the Health Care System of Uzbekistan. Consultation of problematic diseases in our country and their treatment in Germany, developed by our doctors

It is being supported to increase their qualifications in the clinics of the European countries. Also, the organization is investing in scarce medicines.

With the help of our society, many cooperation agreements were signed between Uzbek and German universities. In accordance with academic exchange agreements, dozens of students are studying in Germany, and young Uzbek scientists are returning to German universities for doctoral theses.

In cooperation with creative associations and foundations of German-speaking countries, we actively participate in introducing Uzbek translators to the works of world-famous writers such as Johann Wolfgang Goethe, Heinrich Heine, Hermann Hesse, Thomas and Heinrich Mann, Franz Kafka, Stefan Schweig, Arno Geiger and financially stimulating their creative work. In particular, the cooperation established with SAD - Austrian academic exchange service has been playing an important role in the study and improvement of qualifications of Uzbek students and German scientists abroad through scholarships of various sizes for several years.



However, it should be said that, despite the wide conditions created in the education system of our country, the teaching of the German language in higher and secondary special educational institutions and schools is not at the level of world standards.

The fact that the personnel who are growing up in our country do not have a high chance of knowing the German language and being able to converse easily in it is clearly manifested in various international meetings, conferences and seminars organized in our country, which is increasingly opening its doors to the world. In order to find a solution to these problems, we are currently trying to teach the German language in our country and bring in more qualified personnel, paying more attention to the students.
